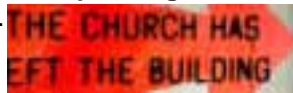

A prayer a day for God's world

Sunday: Pakistan. Last week 3 US soldiers & 2 others were injured in a bomb attack, the first fatal Taliban ambush on the US military in the NW Frontier Province, adjoining Afghanistan. The Americans were assigned to train the local Frontier Force. Education of girls is opposed by the Taliban; many schoolgirls were injured & 3 killed in the same explosion outside their secondary school. Pray against the Taliban.

Monday: Iran, especially after the news that the US plans to station missile defences in neighbouring Arab states such as Kuwait. The hard-line Islamic regime of President Ahmadinejah & the supreme leader Ayatollah Ali Khomeini is becoming increasingly authoritarian, suppressing internal dissent, including from the defeated candidates in the disputed Presidential elections last June. Keep praying for peace in the Middle East.

Tuesday: Continue to pray for **Haiti** as relief & reconstruction work goes on after the devastating earthquake last month. Pray for restoration of effective sanitation & control of infectious diseases, for co-operation among the international relief teams & for churches, especially as they offer support & shelter to the vulnerable.

Wednesday: Sudan. Pray for the first democratic elections in 24 years, due in April. The President, Omar al-Bashir, could face genocide charges in the International Criminal Court. He backed Arab Janjaweed militias who killed many thousands in Darfur, but he has widespread support in Arab & African countries.

Thursday: China, where there's still great poverty, especially in rural areas, although it now has the 2nd largest economy after the USA. The government suppresses opposition, including by interfering with the internet. The 'one child' policy has led to abandonment of baby girls. Pray for the growing church in China, still under persecution.

Friday: GB. Give thanks for the defeat of the government in the House of Lords on 25th Jan on an amendment to the Equality Bill which will allow churches to make staff appointments in line with their doctrinal & moral views. Pray that this amendment will not be overturned when it returns to the House of Commons. Pray generally for the rights of Christians, who may become increasingly marginalised in the name of 'liberal values'.

Saturday: The debate on **Climate Change** & for openness among climate researchers.
