A Prayer A Day For God's World

Sunday Zimbabwe, once the breadbasket of Africa & now a place of hunger & starvation. Pray that the power-sharing government will not be obstructed by Mugabe's 'war veterans' etc. The church is prayerful, strong & full of hope in spite of the circumstances. Pray that there will be no obstruction to international aid, but also for improved farming methods/self-sufficiency.

Monday Afghanistan. Pray for the British soldiers, now coming towards the end of their deployment in Sangin, the area of Helmand province infamous for explosive devices. They are to be replaced by US troops in the Autumn. Almost 1/3 of the 300 British soldiers killed in Afghanistan have died there; pray that their deaths will not be in vain, that Taliban control of the area will be broken & that there will be effective, democratic government. Pray that other crops will replace the poppies grown for illegal heroin in a trade masterminded by smugglers.

Tuesday Christians in **Latin America** & the missions of Latin Link, particularly for the Amazon basin where local rainforest tribes are under pressure from the incursion of logging, oil, gas & mining companies. As well as threatening local people, these activities contribute to global warming. **Peru** has recently ordered the expulsion of a British Catholic missionary known for promoting indigenous rights.

Wednesday Keith & Daniel Myers who are in USA, with Mission trips into **Mexico**. Daniel will be helping with Youth work outreach, including basketball training. Keith will use his technical skills & also help with mission.

Thursday Mauritania, West Africa, a very poor country with very high child malnutrition, a harsh climate & low literacy rate. The country is almost entirely desert. Islam is entrenched; there are ethnic tensions, eg between Moorish peoples & Black Africans, often over limited water & arable land. There's no indigenous church & hostility to anything Christian. Pray for Dr Ian Ward & his family (from Southampton) who work there with an NGO.

Friday Iran where Sakineh Mohammadi (43) is facing death by stoning for adultery, after a conviction which her family claim is bogus. Pray that international pressure will cause Iran to quash these barbaric sentences.

Saturday Lebanon which has many Palestinian refugees. Its Grand Ayatollah Fadlallah was buried last week. Pray for peace among the factions—Shia, Sunni, Druze & Christian.
