A Prayer A Day For God's World

Sunday Pray for an end to violence in Africa. In **Uganda** 74 people watching the World Cup Final were killed by bombs placed by Somali Islamist militants (al-Shabab), who claim links with al-Quida & the Union of Islamic Courts. They are trying to overthrow the government of **Somalia**, & attacked Uganda because of its peacekeeping role in Mogadishu.

Monday Ewen, John, Nick, Martin & Fenella in **Goma**—see Tim's bulletins for Ewen's emails. Pray for health & safety, & for their long journey home on Saturday. Pray long term for the many aspects of the HEAL Africa project, especially for the thousands of rape victims.

Tuesday 8 of our young people & 6 leaders leave today for 3 weeks in **Lesotho**. Pray for the leaders, & that faith will be strengthened as they learn about a needy culture & develop their skills doing the Lord's work in co-operation with each other & with local Christians

Wednesday Northern Ireland in the aftermath of the marching season. Young people (some only 8 years) joined clashes of some dissident republican splinter groups attacking Orangemen. Riot police were attacked with stones, bottles & petrol bombs & Protestant groups burnt Irish flags, etc. Pray that the residual bitterness between communities will settle & not pass to younger generation.

Thursday Pray for an end to virtual civil war in **Iraq**, especially for the women who are suppressed & often barely aware that their husbands are involved in Sunni terrorist insurgency. Such groups are linked to al-Quida & attack indiscriminately Shia mosques, other factions, the Army, police, those linked with USA, etc. Many bystanders are often killed..

Friday India has economic growth & a growing, fairly affluent middle class. But a recent 'multi-dimensional' report indicates there are as many poor people in eight states as in countries of sub-Saharan Africa. More than 410 million live in poverty in Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal & especially Madhya Pradesh, where malnutrition is a severe problem. The caste system keeps Dalits in perpetual poverty. Pray for the Church & for training of Christian leaders, & for maintenance of religious freedom.
